## O.A.A.S. Youth Poster Competition

"Original Hand Made Design"

The fair board will mount the winner on black art card for the OAAS District 7 competition in November, and if a winner at that competition, will forward the poster to the OAAS Convention in Toronto in February next year for further prizes.
